Reception Classes – Acorn and Chestnut

In Reception this week we have been continuing our work on animals. We enjoyed looking at reptiles and exploring where they live. The children completed some amazing writing labelling a picture of a tortoise.

In maths we have been identifying odd and even numbers, the children used each other to work out if the groups were odd or even.

We had lots of fun in art using the clay. The children have started to make an animal of their choice, which we will leave to dry before painting.



Year 1 – Hawthorn and Willow

In Maths, we have continued looking at multiplication and introduced 'arrays' as well as doubling and sharing.

In RE we were fortunate to have a visitor, (Miss Inskip) who is a practising Muslim, to talk to both classes about different aspects of her religion. The children were particularly interested in the 99 names of Allah and the traditional dress she wears. In Geography, we learnt about how aerial photographs are taken and also talked about the human and

physical features of the seaside.

Year 2 – Maple and Sycamore

This week Year 2 have made pinch pots in art using clay, they have learnt how to use the glue to attach deviations.

The children have written amazing stories from the point of view of the troll in the 3 Billy Goats Gruff. In PSHE this week the children have been learning about money.



Year 3 – Palm and Pine

This week in our Maths lesson pupils have been learning to recognise coins and notes. The children have been learning to identify different denominations of coins and notes commonly used in the UK currency, including £1, £2, 50p, 20p, 10p, 5p, 2p, and 1p. They have also practiced counting money using a variety of coins and notes, including both single coins/notes and mixed amounts. The children have been working hard to understand the value of each coin/note and select appropriate combinations to reach a given total.

Year 4 – Elm and Oak

This week in Year 4 we have continued our work on the digestion system in Science. We have found it super interesting to learn all about what goes on inside our bodies! Ask us about it at home to find out more....

In Art we have been continuing our work on patterns. This week we explored the work of artist William Morris and created our own traced patterns. We will be using these to create our very own fabric designs over the next few weeks.

Our reading text is still keeping us on the edge of our seats! The main character Varjak Paw has just escaped into the Outside and is now in search of help from a dog! Varjak must master the three 'Ways of Jalal'... Moving Circles, Slow Time and Shadow Walking! Will he be successful on his quest, slow the vanishings and save his family?

Conifer class

The children have continued to access their personalised curriculum in English and Maths whilst building and strengthening relationships with their peers and adults. Some of the children continue to access some mainstream lessons in the afternoons.

In our Hamish and Milo sessions, we continue to think more deeply about friendship and what 'friendship' means. We have been thinking about how it feels when our friendships hurt and what we can do about it.

Some children have continued to learn about our senses and have carried out experiments into different smells and tastes! Other children have continued to access many of their lessons with their mainstream class. We have also made junk model musical instruments!

PTA's Uniformerly (Online Preloved uniform)


We'd like to remind everyone that the PTA's Uniformerly (online preloved uniform) shop is live and well stocked. Buying preloved uniform saves you money, recycles items (thus keeping more out of landfill), and raises money for the PTA, and therefore school, to enhance the children's education.

Whether you are in need of summer uniform (e.g. gingham dresses and grey shorts) as we (hopefully) move properly into Spring, or are looking to stock up on bigger sizes for September, it is worth taking a look.

To search, use a combination of the size (e.g. 6 or 7/8) and item term (e.g. trousers, pinafore, polo, branded) to reduce the items in view.



It's quick and easy to register to make a purchase. Payments are made via Paypal straight to the PTA and orders will be sent home with your child within a week.

All items are in excellent condition: they are clean, with no marks, no holes, no fading and very limited bobbling. If we wouldn't be happy receiving any particular item for our own children to wear, we haven't put it in the shop.
