Reception Classes – Acorn and Chestnut

Reception have enjoyed continuing our learning about the world this week. We visited Australia in our learning and explored lots of facts about this continent. The children have enjoyed painting animals and using maps to find Australia in the world.

Thank you to all the parents who were able to make PE with me. We appreciate as working parents how difficult this is to coordinate especially with day changes. The children had lots of fun exploring all the activities we put out as did the adults!

Year 1 - Hawthorn and Willow

We have had real fun this week with our DT day. Together we made and decorated some biscuits, made fruit skewers and of course, ate them!

In Maths, we continued to learn about time, thinking about the days of the week and the months of the year.

In RE, we completed our work on Islam. The children were able to talk in some detail about what they had learnt.

In Science this week, we looked at the changing seasons, and more specifically, summer. We learnt that we have more hours of daylight than any other season. The children decided what clothes they should wear in summer, although this week has not felt particularly Summery!

Year 2 - Maple and Sycamore

We have had an amazing week building up to completing our DT project. We enjoyed evaluating a range of dips and dippers and some of us were brave enough to try some new things! We then focused on our food hygiene skills and thought about how to be safe in the kitchen. Ask us about the bridge and claw hold for when chopping!

In English we have been learning all about non-fiction writing, specifically about bugs. It has been brilliant getting to learn about lots of different creatures and display our work in a range of ways. We have learned about flies, bees, ants and beetles and how different bugs move.

Lastly, we have been exploring position and direct in Maths. We have been working on understanding clockwise and anti-clockwise along with quarter turns and half turns. We really enjoyed using the BeeBots and having a go at following different instructions.

Year 3 - Palm and Pine

This week, year 3 have been planning and writing short stories in their English lessons. The children have demonstrated their growing skills in English by creating imaginative narratives, including a clear beginning, middle, and end. Year 3 have showcased their ability to use descriptive language, including adjectives and adverbs, to bring their characters and settings to life. They also practiced using direct speech to extend their sentences and enhance their writing, really bringing depth and understanding to their stories. The Year 3 team have enjoyed reading the creative stories that the children have written, what brilliant imaginations they all have!

Year 4 - Elm and Oak

Year 4 have been very busy this week reminiscing. They have thought all about their special memories from Silsoe Lower ready for our leavers' worship next Friday. They have also been practising very hard some beautiful songs. Tissues need to be at the ready! They have also thought about the rules they might set themselves for how they use a mobile phone in the future to ensure they are always safe.

Conifer class

The children have continued to access their personalised curriculums for all subjects whilst building and strengthening relationships with their peers and adults. Some of the children continue to access some mainstream lessons in the afternoons.

We have thought about transition, change and loss this week – listening to the story 'Badger's Parting Gifts'. We talked about how it is OK to be sad about someone or a pet who has died and all the things we can do to remember them. We discussed how to make ourselves feel better when we are sad and who we can talk to. The children have really shown empathy and kindness this week.
