Reception Classes – Acorn and Chestnut

In reception this week we have been learning all about London. The children have explored maps of London and located famous landmarks such as Big Ben and Buckingham Palace. We enjoyed painting pictures of these places and creating our own maps.

The children continued their learning on repeating patterns in maths and we explored 3D shapes too.

In RE this week the children have learnt about Jesus feeding the 5000, the children have created pictures of fish to represent it.



Year 1 - Hawthorn and Willow

This week has been a really busy week in Year 1.

In History we are learning about castles and why they were built. We are really excited about our trip to Mountfitchet Castle in a few weeks! Molly was inspired by the learning and created her own castle at home.

In English, we have learnt about plurals and what we need to add to the end of words to change them from a singular to a plural.

In Science this week, we have been finding out the differences between wild plants and garden plants. We have had the opportunity to explore some wild flowers on the field and have talked about how the seeds got there. The children drew a plant in their books, labelled it and many were able to explain the purpose for each part of the plant.

We also want to say a really big 'Well Done' to all the children who took part in the 'Phonic's

Screening Checks' this week. ALL the children tried so hard and we are very proud of them!



Year 2 - Maple and Sycamore

We have had a busy week getting to grips with our new topic of 'statistics' in Maths, where we have been focusing on tally charts and block graphs.

In English, we started reading our new book 'The Diary of a Killer Cat' by Anne Fine. We have loved learning more about the character Tuffy and all the naughty things he gets up to!

Lastly, we enjoyed creating some drama in RE to retell the story of Jesus bringing good news to Matthew. We talked about why Jesus may have chosen Matthew to be his disciple and how this may have changed the views of others.





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Year 3 - Palm and Pine

This week in our English lessons, the children have been diving into the world of directed speech. This exciting focus has helped the children understand how to use quotation marks, punctuation, and reporting clauses effectively. Through interactive activities and creative writing exercises, the children are learning to bring their characters to life, making their stories more engaging and dynamic. Encouraging them to practice these skills at home by sharing conversations from their favourite books or creating their own dialogues can further enhance their learning. We are proud to see their progress and enthusiasm in mastering directed speech.

Year 4 - Elm and Oak

Year 4 finally managed to reschedule our marshmallow toasting. The weather was kind to us and we all sat round the fire and roasted the marshmallows to make chocolate smores. The children helped us to sing some camp fire songs too!

We have also had a visit from Mr Roberts from Arnold Academy in preparation for the transition day. The children were able to him questions and share their excitement for the move to middle school.







Conifer class

The children have continued to access their personalised curriculum in English and Maths whilst building and strengthening relationships with their peers and adults. Some of the children continue to access some mainstream lessons in the afternoons.

Some children have been learning about emotions and understanding emotions in others. Other children have continued to access many of their lessons with their mainstream class.

If your child has a temperature for more than 2 days please take them to the doctor to get them checked for an infection.




Silsoe Pre school are recruiting

Medicines in school

Medicines should only be administered in school when it would be detrimental to a child's health or school attendance not to. Medicines should be left at the school office where parents will be asked to give their consent for medication to be administered by completing a Medicine Record Form.

Prescribed medicines

Where clinically possible, medicines are generally prescribed in dose frequencies, which enable them to be taken outside of school hours. For example, antibiotics prescribed to be taken 3 times a day could be given before school, after school and before bed and would not need to be administered in school.

Schools can only accept prescribed medicines that are in-date, labelled, provided in the original container as dispensed by a pharmacist and include instructions for administration, dosage and storage. The exception to this is insulin, which must still be in date, but will generally be available to schools inside an insulin pen or a pump, rather than in its original container.

Non-prescribed medicines

Non-prescribed medicines such as Calpol and Piriton will only be administered in exceptional circumstances and where there is a clear and genuine medical need.

Euro 2024 is well underway and many will be looking forward to exciting matches. Women's Aid have produced the above poster as part of their Come Together to End Domestic Abuse campaign. However, in 2022 data showed that reported incidents of domestic abuse increased by 26% when the England football team plays, with a 38% increase if England lost their game. Reported incidents increased the day after matches by 11%, regardless of the match outcome (research conducted by National Centre for Domestic Violence).

We know that domestic abuse can affect anybody, so support is available to everybody (including if you are concerned about your own behaviours - the Chrysalis Centre or Respect Helpline can provide information).

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
