It may have been the last week of the half term but the children have continued to work hard across the curriculum. Some year groups have been exceptionally busy completing assessments to show the teachers what they understand and can achieve independently.

Children in year 1 have been busy preparing for their phonics screening checks which are taking place after half term. We are delighted with the progress they have made in their phonics understanding this year and are pleased to see the children applying this phonics knowledge to their reading. We hope they continue to enjoy their developing reading skills so that they can access and enjoy many more books.

We are particularly proud of our year 2 children who have been working hard on their Reading, Writing and Maths assessments. Well done children! It's wonderful to see you apply your learning and demonstrate your knowledge and skills so confidently.

As part of our maths curriculum children learn their times tables. This is a skill that children begin in KS1 and embed in KS2. Children in year 4 are expected to have a secure knowledge of all their times tables and should be able to recall them at speed. Children in year 4 have practised their times tables regularly, mostly using the Times Tables Rockstar App, and have been competing with their friends, family members and staff to achieve the highest scores! They are all looking forward to completing the year 4 Multiplication Check after half term and showcasing their skills.

All year groups will be completing end of unit and end of year assessments during the next half term. We look forward to seeing the children shine and demonstrate their growing independence knowledge and skills.

I wish you all an enjoyable half term holiday and hope that the weather is kind to us. We look forward to welcoming the children back to school on Monday 3rd June.

Reception Classes – Acorn and Chestnut

This week the Reception children continued their learning about animals. We have revisited all the different animals we have looked at over the half term and explored the importance of bees on Monday for National Bee Day.

Year 1 – Hawthorn and Willow

In Maths we have started learning about position and direction. We have been playing some fun games using left and right, forwards and backwards.

In Science this week, we have been looking at the difference between deciduous and evergreen trees. We have been thinking about how deciduous trees change through the seasons.

Year 2 – Maple and Sycamore

This week year 2 have created their own micro climates in science and have enjoyed watching different insects coming to visit.

They have started learning to tell the time and have been asked to keep practicing this at home over the half term.

In RE the children have created pledge trees and thought of pledges of how we can loook after the world and how we can look after the people of the world.

Year 3 – Palm and Pine

During science lessons in year 3 this week, the children have been learning about the functions of different plant parts, such as roots, stems, leaves, and flowers, and their



roles in growth and reproduction. During the unit, they have explored the requirements for plant growth, including light, water, air, nutrients, and space. Pupils have also learnt about processes like photosynthesis, respiration, and transpiration and have enjoyed exploring the life cycle of plants, covering germination, pollination, fertilisation, and seed dispersal. Over the past few weeks the children have grown their own plants under varying conditions and have recorded their growth.

Year 4 – Elm and Oak

On Monday in Oak class, we did art and made repeated patterns. Our inspiration was William Morris.

On Tuesday we did music and I played my clarinet. We were writing rhythms and making them into a melody. We learnt about decimals in maths.

In English we are reading a book about the boy who banned the dark and we were planning a balanced argument for and against.

In French we practiced asking which animals we all have.

Conifer class

The children have continued to access their personalised curriculum in English and Maths whilst building and strengthening relationships with their peers and adults. Some of the children continue to access some mainstream lessons in the afternoons. We are watching our sunflowers and hoping that they grow some more soon!

Some children have continued to learn about animals and classifying into carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. Other children have continued to access many of their lessons with their mainstream class. We have also made lovely cupcakes!

If your child has a temperature for more than 2 days please take them to the doctor to get them checked for an infection.



Medicines in school

Medicines should only be administered in school when it would be detrimental to a child's health or school attendance not to. Medicines should be left at the school office where parents will be asked to give their consent for medication to be administered by completing a Medicine Record Form.

Prescribed medicines

Where clinically possible, medicines are generally prescribed in dose frequencies, which enable them to be taken outside of school hours. For example, antibiotics prescribed to be taken 3 times a day could be given before school, after school and before bed and would not need to be administered in school.

Schools can only accept prescribed medicines that are in-date, labelled, provided in the original container as dispensed by a pharmacist and include instructions for administration, dosage and storage. The exception to this is insulin, which must still be in date, but will generally be available to schools inside an insulin pen or a pump, rather than in its original container.

Non-prescribed medicines

Non-prescribed medicines such as Calpol and Piriton will only be administered in exceptional circumstances and where there is a clear and genuine medical need.

Eco Council

A big thank you goes to the Eco Council, who have been working incredibly hard so far this year to try and gain Green Flag status for the school. A huge thank you also goes to all the parents who have also supported us. We have now completed and submitted the application. We will keep you informed of any news.

Year 4 walking to school

For the remainder of this school year and to aid their preparation for joining middle school in September, we are happy to authorise Year 4 only pupils <u>walking to school</u> unsupervised. If your child has additional needs, please carefully consider if they are safe to walk to school unsupervised.

We would however ask that parents/carers continue to <u>collect</u> their child at the end of the school day to ensure they do arrive home safely.


Please let us know if your child is not attending school as early as possible, we will follow our normal safeguarding procedures following up on any absence immediately after registration closes at 9am.


