Reception Classes – Acorn and Chestnut

In Reception this week, we have enjoyed the sun at last! The children have enjoyed finding mini beasts and looking at them through a magnifying glass. They have read outside and practised more for Sports day. In RE this week the children listened to a Buddhist story and enjoyed acting out what the characters did in the story. It was great to see some excellent little actors in both classes.

The children have continued to think about different parts of the world, this week focusing on Africa. They recapped the animals that live here and thought about what the weather might be like

in an African country. In Art we created African sunset pictures using pastels and chalks. The children enjoyed getting very messy creating these!

Year 1 – Hawthorn and Willow

In History this week, they have been learning about the different types of castles in preparation for our trip to Mounfitchet castle on Friday next week. The children were really beginning to understand the differences between motte and bailey, stone keep and concentric castles.

In English, they are beginning to think about 'Recounts' and how these can be used. The children are hoping to write their own recount after our trip.

In Maths, the children have been introduced to 'Money' and the value of some of the coins.

They have really enjoyed our Science this week, observing and drawing plants, but looking really closely at the structure of different parts of the plant.

Year 2 – Maple and Sycamore

In Year 2 the children have thoroughly enjoyed their week! They have been busy drawing pictograms, diving back into the past and learning all about the mischief Tuffy the cat has caused.

In our History lessons they have been looking at Queen Victoria and the inventions created during the Victorian Era, they loved finding out about all the incredible creations such as the public flushing toilets, first postage stamps and the first photographs!

During their Science lessons they have been exploring food chains and how animals are suited to their environment. It was great to see the children thinking about how the animals fit into their environment and how they survive.

Lastly, we enjoyed creating some drama pieces linked to our English book where we became Mum, Dad and Ellie discussing how to deal with their naughty cat Tuffy!

Year 3 – Palm and Pine

This week in geography, our Year 3 children have been exploring various European countries and their unique features. They have identified and learned about the different currencies, flags, and languages of these countries. It's been an exciting and enriching experience, helping them gain a deeper understanding of Europe's diverse cultural landscape.

Year 4 – Elm and Oak

In Maths, Year 4 have begun a new unit on time. They are learning how minutes in an hour, so we can work out how many minutes in 5 hours and how many seconds in 5 hours. They are using

Today, Year 4 went on historical walk around our village. They visited the church and had a talk from one of the Wardens about its history. They also visited other places of historical importance around the village such as Wrest Park, the Old School and the Lock Up.

The children have continued to access their personalised curriculum in English and Maths whilst building and strengthening relationships with their peers and adults. Some of the children continue to access some mainstream lessons in the afternoons.

In our Hamish and Milo sessions, we continue to think more deeply about friendship and what 'friendship' means. We have drawn our friends and labelled what makes them a good friend.

Some children have continued to access many of their lessons with their mainstream class. We have also made the most of the sunshine and been outside a lot!

Medicines in school

Medicines should only be administered in school when it would be detrimental to a child's health or school attendance not to. Medicines should be left at the school office where parents will be asked to give their consent for medication to be administered by completing a Medicine Record Form.

Prescribed medicines

Where clinically possible, medicines are generally prescribed in dose frequencies, which enable them to be taken outside of school hours. For example, antibiotics prescribed to be taken 3 times a day could be given before school, after school and before bed and would not need to be administered in school.

Schools can only accept prescribed medicines that are in-date, labelled, provided in the original container as dispensed by a pharmacist and include instructions for administration, dosage and storage. The exception to this is insulin, which must still be in date, but will generally be available to schools inside an insulin pen or a pump, rather than in its original container. Non-prescribed medicines

Non-prescribed medicines such as Calpol and Piriton will only be administered in exceptional circumstances and where there is a clear and genuine medical need.
