Reception Classes – Acorn and Chestnut

The children have been amazing this week even in the very hot weather. We had lots of fun at the start of the week for French day. The children enjoyed a French show of Goldilocks. This was interactive and the children loved learning and using lots of French words.

We have continued to practise for sports day too this week. We practised running on the field making sure we stay straight and in our own lanes!

It was lovely to see so many of you on Wednesday at the book look. The progress your children have made this year is fantastic. The children I am sure are very excited for their new adventure in Year 1 and enjoyed a great day meeting their new teacher on Thursday.

Year 1 - Hawthorn and Willow

In maths we have been looking at money and more specifically notes. We have comparing notes and coins.

In PSHE we have been learning about what is safe and unsafe both outside and in the house. We have also continued to talk about change and have discussed moving into year 2.

In History we have been labelling different features of castle. We have continued to prepare for our trip to Mountfitchet Castle. Did you know that Mountfitchet Castle is the only castle in the country that has been rebuilt on the exact plan of the original castle?

Year 2 - Maple and Sycamore

This week we had an amazing day celebrating French Day and thoroughly enjoyed being Year 3 for the day!

On Tuesday we loved creating our own collages in the style of French artist Henri Matisse and completing the treasure hunt. In our English lessons we finished reading Diary of Killer Cat and laughed at the twist ending.

In Maths we have started our new topic looking at position and direction.

Year 3 - Palm and Pine

Year 3 have had a super Science lesson this week, recapping on their previous learning about Light! We discussed how shadows are made and what type of objects make them and then used torches and different opaque objects to create shadows. Well done Year 3!

Year 4 - Elm and Oak

We went on a walk around the fields behind our school to identify leaves by looking at their characteristics. We found lots of Oak and Silver Birch trees.

We loved our activities on French day. We learnt all about the Eiffel tower and learnt how to draw it and then went onto create a new Eiffel Tower monster. We were also very lucky to speak to some Year 8 children from Arnold who answered our questions and help us to get excited about

transition day. Arnold teachers also came to see us this week. We were very brave and completed some assessments to help them organise things for September.

Today, we had PSHE lesson all about the changes we are going to experience as we enter puberty.

Thank you to all the parents, staff and children for their enthusiasm and support for this day.
























Round Cottage visit


